













Half-Term 'Live Simply' Art Challenge

This week, in school, we have been finding out about how **climate change** is affecting people around the world and how we can live out our faith by caring for the world around us.

We thought about how we can stop wasting energy, use cleaner energy sources and reduce pollution. We saw an example how drought, made worst by climate change, meant that farmers in West Africa could not feed their animals.

Therefore, as part of our 'Live Simply' journey, we are asking you to take part in CAFOD's 'Get Creative for Climate Justice.'

What you need to do

Get creative – create a piece of art about your thoughts on climate justice to show to your local Member of Parliament. Show what you know about how we can better care for our world and who this will benefit.

In order to take part in the final showpiece exhibition at the Houses of Parliament, there are some quick and simple guidelines:

- It should be produced on paper or card.
- It could be created using paint, ink, pastels, pencils or screen print, or be a print of digital artwork or a photo.
- It should be accompanied by a brief caption or title outlining the thinking behind it, and the first name of the child and the school.
- It must be respectful and inclusive.
